"We shall kill every single enemy who will try to prevent us from reaching our aims," he said. "We are now in a real war. Jews are coming to us from all parts and by land, sea and later probably by air," he declared. "We must prove to the world that we are ready to stick to our Palestine more than at any other time in our history.

"We are the nephews of the martyrs who died before, and we
