Abd el-Krim Offers to Serve

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JERUSALEM, May 1 (U.P.)—A Cairo dispatch today said that Emir Abd el-Krim, exiled Riff leader now in Egypt, had placed himself at King Farouk's disposal as "a soldier for any duties to save Palestine," according to the paper Akhbar el Yom.

Abd el-Krim took refuge in Egypt after twenty-one years'

exile in French hands.

In Amman, Trans-Jordan capital, Arab military talks were continuing today after a secret conference yesterday of Arab leaders addressed by King Abdullah of Trans-Jordan, according to a Damascus report.

Emir Abdul Illah, Regent of Iraq, the Prime Ministers of Syria and the Lebanon and and the Defense Ministers and Chiefs of Staff of all three countries attended the conference, and, after hearing King Abdullah, divided into political and military committees.

After the first committee meeting ended Jamil Mardam Bey, Syrian Prime Minister, said: "We are all ready now for decisive action."

Ismail Sai vai Pasha, Commander in Chief of the Arab volunteer army in Palestine, is a member of the military committee.

Emir Abdul Illah, who flew back

to Baghdad last night but left his Defense Minister and military staff in Amman, issued an order of the day to the Iraqi army calling them to "save Palestine from Zionist imperialism" with "the full cooperation of the Arab armies that are advancing with you in the march on Palestine."
