EGYPTIAN SENATE APPROVES INVASION

Backs Plan to Send Army Into Palestine — Farouk Bars Zionist State in Mid-East

CAIRO, Egypt, May 11 (P)— The Egyptian Senate approved tonight a proposal that the Egyptian Army "shall with other Arab armies enter Palestine at a suitable time to restore stability and prevent massacres in Palestine."

The proposal was presented at a closed session by Premier Mahmoud Fahmy Nokrashy Pasha. It was drafted at a meeting of a special Senatorial committee representing all political parties.

The Senate also approved an allocation of £4,000,000 (\$16,600,000) for additional expenses of the Egyptian Army stationed along the southern border of Palestine.

Earlier an Egyptian Army informant said two infantry battalions were on their way to the border. They will bring the Egyptian armed forces reported there to about 15,000 men.

He said three Egyptian Royal Air Force squadrons were stationed at the frontier.

Dispatches from Damascus said that most diplomatic sources believed that the Arab armies would begin moving into Palestine shortly after Friday midnight.
